>Eagan High School

Since its opening in 1990, Eagan High School has exemplified the district's pursuit of excellence in education. Rapid growth has catapulted the formerly "rural" district to major suburban status with over 4,000 employees serving over 150,000 district residents and over 29,000 students in 35 schools. The Rosemount - Apple Valley - Eagan School District (#196) is the 4th largest school district in Minnesota.

School features include:

- All students use iPads to enhance teaching and learning.

Our student body, grades 9-12, numbers 2,175 young men and women. The graduating class of 2022 numbered 500 students. Currently, our class of 2026 has 602 students. The ethnicity percentages at EHS for 2020-21 are 8.79% African American, 10.53% Asian, 63.58% Caucasian, 11.76% Hispanic and less than 1% Native American/Alaskan.

>Faculty and Staff

Currently, there are nearly 195 faculty and staff, including 121 classroom teachers. The EHS Principal and two Assistant Principals have Doctoral Degrees, two of the Assistants have Specialist Degrees and 84% of the Eagan faculty have Masters or similar advanced degrees. The Eagan faculty is composed of professional educators with experience and training in learning theory, motivational techniques, culturally proficient teaching, professional learning communities, higher-order thinking skills and the use of technology to enhance teaching and learning. Their commitment to EHS and its students is apparent with over 60% of them coaching and advising co-curricular activities for our students.

>Graduation Requirements

Eagan High School is organized in a trimester system with seven class periods per day. Thus, students may earn 21 trimester credits per year. Requirements include:

- 12 credits in English/Communications (4 years)
 12 credits in Social Studies (4 years)
 9 credits in Mathematics (3 years)
 9 credits in Science (3 years)
 4 credits in Physical Education
 3 credits in Health and Safety Education
 17 credits in electives chosen by the student, including 1 Fine Arts credit
- 66 Total Trimester Credits

The majority of students exceed this minimum of 66 credits by the time of graduation with most graduates earning 80 or more trimester credits.

>GPA/Honors Status

A student may choose to take one course each trimester with the grade/pass option. There are no weighted grades in the GPA calculation. The median 2023 senior class GPA was 3.367. Honors Status is awarded to students who earn a "C" or better in at least six Honors/Advanced Placement/College in the Schools classes in each of the four years, or a total of at least 24 trimester classes in Honors/Advanced Placement/ College in the Schools.

>Comprehensive Curriculum

Eagan High School offers more than 450 different trimester courses in 14 subject areas or departments along with a full range of special education courses, work program alternatives and career development electives. These courses are designed to meet the needs of students across a broad range of abilities, interests and post-high school aspirations. The offerings of these departments are as follows:

- Art: 15 trimester courses are offered in areas including drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture, graphic communications, and Advanced Placement Portfolio.
- Business: Accounting, computers in business, fashion merchandising, introduction to business, IT exploration, marketing, personal money management, sports and entertainment marketing, Start your own business, video production, and yearbook are offered.
- Career Development: Courses include aviation and ground school, certified nursing assistant, hospitality management, mentor seminar and mentor field experience.
- English/Language Arts: Emphasis is on writing, reading and speech. Elective courses include mythology, film study, creative writing, science fiction and fantasy, and reading seminar. Advanced Placement Literature, and Language/Composition are offered, as are College in the Schools: Writing/Literature, and CIS: Public Speaking, which are University of MN courses.
- Family and Consumer Sciences: Life 101, Intro to Teaching, Interior Design, Child Developement, Infant & Toddler, & Foods are offered.
- Languages of the World: Four years of German and five years of French and Spanish are offered. University of MN College in the Schools: French, Spanish and German are offered.
- Mathematics: A variety of ability levels of algebra, geometry, and precalculus are offered, as well as Advanced Placement Statistics and Advanced Placement Calculus AB and BC, Advanced Placement Computer Science and Multivariable Calculus (Calc III), and Mobile App Development. ACT prep is offered T1 and T2.

 Performing Arts: Curricular instrumental and choral music offerings include five choirs and five bands which are skill and age grouped. Numerous co-curricular groups are available. Advanced Placement Music Theory is also offered.

 Physical Education and Health: Offerings include two required health courses, first aid and prevention, safety education (driver education and CPR/AED instruction), ninth grade physical education and 22 elective courses including aerobics, weight training courses, power volleyball, stress management, self defense, and a variety of lifetime sports activities.

 Science: Core courses include physical earth science, biology, chemistry and physics (both Honors and regular choices). Additional courses in Biology of MN, astronomy, field geology, meteorology, Advanced Placement Chemistry, Advanced Placement Biology, University of MN CIS Human Physiology and Summer Science Institute are offered.

 Social Studies: Courses include series in American History, world history/civilization, civics, government, geography, economics, sociology and psychology. Students may choose a number of electives including Advanced Placement in grades 10-12 and Honors in 9th grade.

 Special Services: A full range of educational alternatives with varying degrees of mainstream and small group instruction is offered for students who qualify for special education services. Students may receive English Language Learners instruction or tutoring.

 Technology/Media: Students and faculty use the most advanced technology to facilitate and promote learning in all curricular areas including broadcast and video production courses. Research capabilities include a comprehensive print collection, eBooks, audio books and 24/7 access to numerous online databases. Technology, Engineering & Manufacturing: Course areas include graphics, drafting, web design, video production, engineering, aviation, transportation, construction, manufacturing, fabrication, welding, and small engines. Students are encouraged to explore the human-made world through projects that require critical thinking, problem-solving, and technical aptitude.
